the aim of our school is to give a child an excellent pre-school nursery education together with a solid background in the Russian Language, leading to English/ Russian bilingualism. Learning a new language at this age is quick, spontaneous and effective - by the age of 11 it's often too late for a solid grounding in a second language to develop.

The Russian Language Nursery School is for children aged between two and a half and five, whose parents want them to develop language skills in Russian from early childhood. If one or more of the parents speaks Russian at home, so much the better, but this is by no means a prerequisite.


The curriculum is designed to integrate two elements:

 We follow the English education system particularly the early learning requirements for pre-school education, combined with:

Our own methodology, using Russian pre-school methods and some Montessori activities and prac-

tices.

The school uses Russian for 90% of language instructions and care alongside a few English lessons a week.



The school is regularly inspected by Ofsted and follows its standards, guidelines and requirements.

The nursery school is also associated with the Russian Language Kids Club which holds monthly meetings and events. It provides an opportunity for children and parents to socialise, primarily though the Russian lan-guage, and has a library plus information centre. The Kids Club is open to all.

The Russian Language Nursery (closest tube, Richmond) and is open for 5 sessions a week (Monday to Friday). There are a few once-a-week, part-time places available for those who want a very general introduction to Russian. Full-time attendance is advised for maximum benefit.
